- **Ambition is not the problem - need clear actionable & measurable targets.**
- **Accurate baselines can support realistic & evidence-based targets**



**African Climate
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- **Tier 2 inventories are critical to setting locally relevant targets that do not impede on development priorities - particularly for Agriculture sector**



**African Climate
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Partnering on climate action in Africa

- **Sectoral stakeholders need to be involved in development of NDCs to ensure alignment of development priorities & foster economy-wide buy-in**



An a-political platform that brings together countries in the region, to collaborate on common challenges and regional ambitions in support of NDCs and LTS.



Building capacities of national & sub-national governments, private sector and domestic financial institutions to support NDC implementation



Grid-Scale Renewable Energy CoP

(60+ members)
Peer learning, knowledge exchange and expert assistance on adoption of Distributed Energy Resources (DER) to the grid; integration of Battery Energy Storage Systems (BESS) and Green Hydrogen.



NDC Finance CoP

(50+ members) Focuses on blended capital, green bonds and carbon markets to support achieving NDC targets and LT-LEDS.



Building Energy Efficiency CoP

(100+ members)
Focuses on building energy efficiency measures and on converging activities to accelerate them at the sub-national and national levels.

COMMUNITIES OF PRACTICE (CoPs)

Clean Mobility CoP

(60+ members)
Discussion on challenges and opportunities in usage of clean fuels and electric mobility for public transport.

Sub-national Integration CoP

(50+ members) Discussion on frameworks, challenges and opportunities for enabling multi-level climate governance, to achieve NDC targets.
